

# Bill Clinton – Future Global President?

Earth-shaking changes lie ahead for the world's political bodies, including the United Nations. Could William Jefferson Clinton, former impeached U.S. president, soon find himself in his “dream job” – Secretary-General of the United Nations and chief of the “New World Order” – or, to put it plainly, “President of the World”? The idea is not so far-fetched as you may think! The plot is afoot, and the underground machinations are in the works.

According to John F. Harris, staff writer for the *Washington Post*, Bill Clinton plans to become “President of the world!” He doesn't want to just be a “Secretary-General” like the other previous leaders at the UN rather, he wants to become the “President of the world!”

Harris reported, “In 2001, in the opening months of his ex-presidency, Bill Clinton confided to an aide that he had decided on his dream job for the next chapter of his life: Secretary-General of the United Nations.”

Harris continued: “His ambition, as the aide described it, was both breathtaking and entirely logical for a natural-born politician who had reached the top of the American political ladder: ‘President of the world.’ The goal may not be realistic, Clinton acknowledged, but he then went on to analyze all the factors in minute detail, as though he was preparing for a political campaign: whether a U.S. president would ever see fit to back him, for one, and what it would take to persuade other nations to bend the long-standing tradition that the top job does not go to someone from a country with permanent status on the UN Security Council.’

This September, Bill Clinton is staging an international conference at the United Nations in New York. Harris declared, “That is when a large delegation of world leaders, U.S. politicians, business leaders and celebrities of various stripes will arrive in New York for the first *Clinton Global Initiative*. The event, as Clinton recently described it, is modeled after the famous annual *World Economic Forum* in Davos, Switzerland. But Clinton has said he wants his three-day event to be more focused on concrete results: ‘I'm telling people not to come unless they are prepared to make a commitment to do something when they leave.’” He was referring to the conference's themes of fighting poverty, religious conflict and environmental degradation.

Says J. R. Church in *Prophecy in the News*, “These three themes address the same global problems concocted long ago by the New World Order insiders in order to cause the nations to come together and establish a world government. These are bogus items that really don't need to be fixed. They are problems because the politicians want them to be problems.”

Church points out that seven men have led the United Nations since its beginning in 1946. They are (left to right): Trygve Halvdan Lie (1946-53), Dag Hammarskjold (1953-61), U

Thant (1962-71), Kurt Waldheim (1972-81), Javier Perez de Cuellar (1982-91), Boutros Boutros-Ghali (1992-96), and Ko . Annan (1997). Bill Clinton aspires to become the eighth leader of the UN. However, he has expressed a desire to be more than just a Secretary-General. He wants to be "President of the world!"

Writes J. R. Church, "Clinton has been traveling the world as if he was running for a political office. For the past few months, he has officially represented the UN's relief effort to the tsunami victims. Ex-president George Bush has been traveling with him. In fact, former first lady Barbara Bush recently remarked that they had grown to love Bill and had unofficially adopted him as a member of their family. This September, Clinton will present an agenda on foreign policy that some say is implicitly opposite to that of President Bush. Many of Clinton's foreign policy achievements were rooted in the 'America-as-friend' philosophy he espouses now. This is not the current U. S. policy. President Bush has basically told the world, 'If you're not for us, then you are against us.' Clinton thinks that is a little harsh."

Harris declared, "As the upcoming meeting illustrates, Clinton's post-presidency is in many ways without precedent. Clinton relishes the headlines that invariably follow from his overseas jet-setting. So far this year, he has visited 22 nations and met with more than 30 current or former heads of state."

### **A Messiah Complex?**

J. R. Church relates a fascinating story. He says, "In 1993, I was told by a member of the house of Rothschild, that, many years ago, he was present at a meeting of the family and saw 13-year-old Bill Clinton kneel before a group of rabbis and receive their 'laying of hands on his head, declaring him to be their long-looked-for 'royal boy chosen.'"

"In March 1976, Bill Clinton ran for the office of Arkansas state attorney general. He won that election bid and entered his career of public service in November 1976, at the age of 30 – the same age as the biblical Joseph, David, Ezekiel and Jesus, when they entered their public ministries. That is also the age a Jew has to be in order to enter the priesthood.

"Harris reported that Clinton has said that he regards his future role on the world stage as 'a kind of priesthood...' – a strong statement indeed! This can only mean that Bill Clinton thinks of himself as a messiah figure.

"The *Washington Post* article suggested, 'While the debate continues about Clinton's record as president, his activities as ex-president suggest a man who sees redemptive possibilities on the world stage. Even while president, amid the Monica S. Lewinsky scandal, he described Middle East talks as part of "my personal journey of atonement.'" Clinton used another religious term – 'atonement.' He thinks that, if given another chance, he can do better.

A Messianic complex? Does he indeed picture himself as a kind of redemptive figure – a Messiah of God? The term "Messiah" simply means, "anointed one." Is he an "anointed one" of God? There have been many "anointed ones" down through history – such as Buddha, Nimrod, the Popes, various heads of religions or churches. But the question is – anointed by whom?

Satan the devil is the "god of this world" (I Cor.4:4). He has his "anointed ones" masquerading as ministers of righteousness (II Cor.11:14-16). Who has anointed Bill Clinton – what do his "fruits" prove?

Jesus Christ said, “Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep’s clothing but inwardly are ravening wolves” (Matthew 7:15, NRSV).

He also said, “You will know them by their fruits” (v.16i). “Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and cast into the fire. Thus you will know them by their fruits” (v.19-20).

Will William Jefferson Clinton succeed Kofi Annan as the eighth Secretary-General of the United Nations? Will he try to finish what he started in Israel – by reviving the failed Peace Accord between Israel and the Palestinians?

### **Seven Rulers and the Eighth**

J. R. Church says, “It seems rather prophetic that the UN has had seven rulers. Kofi Annan’s term will be up January 1, 2007. But a great deal of pressure has been put on the Secretary General lately to resign. Will Bill Clinton become the eighth leader of the world body? Will he then aspire to become something more than “Secretary-General?” Will he, as Harris suggested, make himself the “President of the world?” Is this what Clinton calls a “priesthood?”

Interestingly, the Bible speaks of an end-time world system which will have seven rulers, who will be succeeded by an “eighth” – we read in the book of Revelation, “As for the beast that was [in power], but is not [presently in political power], IT IS AN EIGHTH but it belongs to the SEVEN, and it goes to destruction” (Rev.17:9-11).

William Clinton has always had his eye on international politics. Church points out, “As soon as he became U.S. president in early 1993, he held regular meetings with his advisers on Russia, which he regarded as ‘the central foreign policy challenge.’ Harris reported: ‘The years 1993 and 1994 produced a parade of painful episodes abroad. There was the debacle of a peace mission gone awry in Somalia, two years of hand-wringing over ethnic cleansing in Bosnia, and an averted gaze from a genocide that killed 800,000 in Rwanda. Clinton has called failing to act in Rwanda his greatest regret as president.’”

“Harris continued: ‘But, starting with the Dayton accords that ended the Bosnian war in 1995, Clinton began gaining confidence in foreign policy. His signal insight, as veterans of his administration describe it, was the realization that foreign policy was not in the end so different from the subject he knew best, domestic politics. As Clinton saw it, both involved public salesmanship and required leaders who could frame issues to make difficult decisions – such as persuading people to accept a peace accord with historic enemies – politically possible.’”

Most of the Secretaries-General of the UN served eight to ten years. But in 1976, Boutros Boutros-Ghali was forced to resign after only four years, leading to the installment of Kofi Annan. Says Church, “It was rumored that Bill Clinton engineered that scandal.”

Because of Kofi Annan’s role in the ever-growing Iraq Oil for Food scandal, it is very possible that the Secretary-General could, for the good of the UN, and to prevent an indictment against himself, be pressured to offer his resignation, and he may agree to do so.

Who would replace Annan? The fact is, there are no legal roadblocks for a Clinton election to the UN’s top post. It was Bill Clinton who, as president of the U.S., sponsored Annan’s move to unseat Boutros Boutros-Ghali in 1996. Around the UN’s corridors, Annan was privately referred to as “Clinton’s boy.”

Despite Clinton's often veiled criticism of Bush and his policies, he remains friends with the Bush family. Clinton thinks Bush has weakened U.S. standing in the world by being too dismissive of allies and projecting an image of American arrogance abroad.

President Bush continues to speak highly of Clinton – something Harris calls “regular rhetorical bouquets.” And the president's father continues to run around the world with Clinton. Says J. R. Church, “There must be something there – something more than meets the eye. Many have long felt that the Senior Bush deliberately threw the 1992 election in favor of Clinton. When Bush looked at his watch during one of the debates, and seemed bored at the whole thing, the press claimed that Clinton seemed more presidential. For years before that, Bush (former head of the CIA) ran the Contra-arms deliveries out of a small airport in Mena, Arkansas. He and Clinton had to be on the same political page back then.

“Harris said, ‘For all the new rapport in the Bush-Clinton relationship – Bush . . . assigning him to visit tsunami-stricken areas – the two presidents represent twin poles in a pointed ideological debate. Since Sept. 11, 2001, has been at the center of national politics, this argument about the relative balance of force vs. persuasion in U.S. foreign policy has been at the middle of domestic politics.’”

### **Clinton Wants a “Second Chance”**

Harris declares: “In the United States, the debate over Bush's approach to the world and Clinton's – between force and persuasion – remains unsettled. But it seems apparent which approach is more winning abroad. While Bush has generated deep suspicion, especially in Western Europe, Clinton is highly popular. Europeans who chafe at Bush respond to Clinton's ‘inclusive, soft-toned way of communicating with the world, and especially with Europeans,’ said Arnout Brouwers, a prominent Dutch editor who has studied American politics in Washington with the German Marshall Fund. ‘His personal history, his charms, even his personal failings, helped people identify with him as one of us.’”

### **Mayor of Jerusalem?**

In a report by *Reuters* (July 22, 2003), Shimon Peres, the head of Israel's opposition Party suggested resolving the Israeli/Palestinian conflict over Jerusalem by putting its holy sites under UN steward-ship. His plan called for declaring a holy area of sites sacred to Jews, Christians and Muslims in Jerusalem's old walled city as a world capital with the UN Secretary-General serving as mayor!

Says J. R. Church, “If this ever becomes policy, and Bill Clinton takes the top UN spot, then he could become the Mayor of Jerusalem. During his presidency, Clinton visited Jerusalem and heard the crowds shout, ‘We want a king like Clinton!’” ([www.prophecyinthenews.com](http://www.prophecyinthenews.com)).
